Major University Operating Funds

Unrestricted Funds:

- State Appropriations:
 - General revenue funding from State of Illinois
- Income Fund:
 - Tuition income and other miscellaneous income (e.g., Library/IT student fee, interest, etc.)
- Institutional Funds:
 - Indirect cost recovery (ICR) from sponsored research programs
 - Royalties from patents, copyright and licensing activities
 - Administrative allowances from overhead charges to auxiliaries and other self-supporting functions

Major University Operating Funds

Restricted Funds:

- Sponsored Programs:
 - Primarily federal grants for research activities (NIH, NSF, etc)
- Federal Appropriations:
 - Funds provided by Federal Govt for agriculture programs in ACES
- Private Gift & Endowment Income:
 - Gift funds received from donors in support of the University's annual operating budget.
 - Endowment funds investment income on endowments for use in annual operating budget.

Major University Operating Funds

Restricted Funds Cont'd:

- Auxiliaries and Departmental Operations
 - Units generating revenue from sale of products and services e.g., Housing, Assembly Hall, Illini Union, UI bookstore, DIA, Parking, Vet Clinics, etc.
 - Most student fees are deposited into these types of funds
- Academic Facilities Maintenance Fund Assessment (AFMFA)
 - Fee initiated in 2007 to assist with University's deferred maintenance backlog.

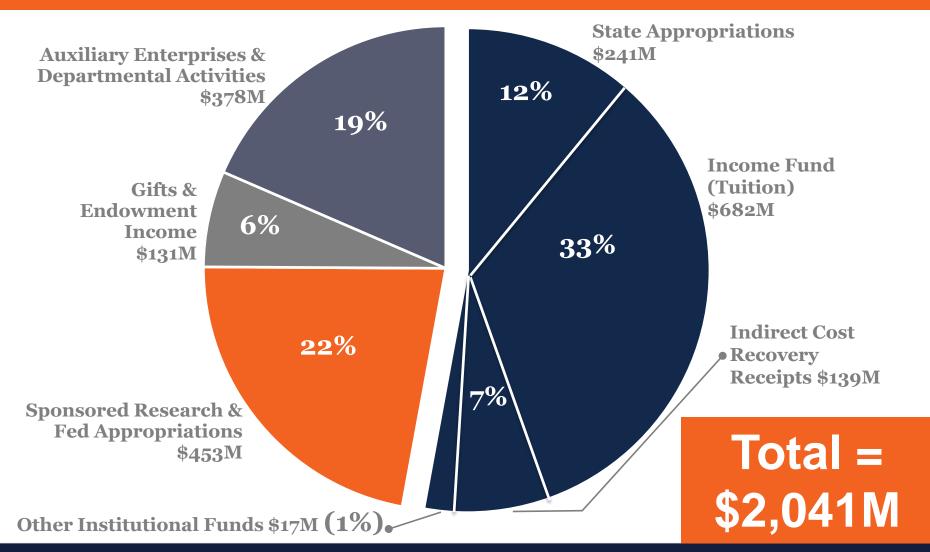


FY 15 UIUC Budget by Fund

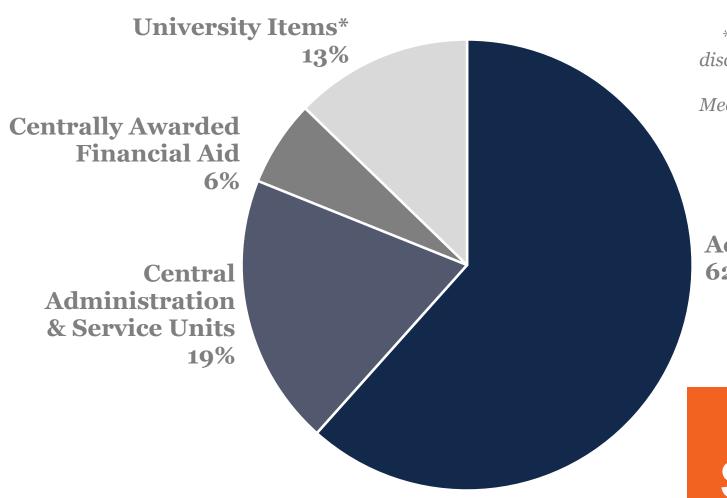

Budget Allocations FY15 (Unrestricted)

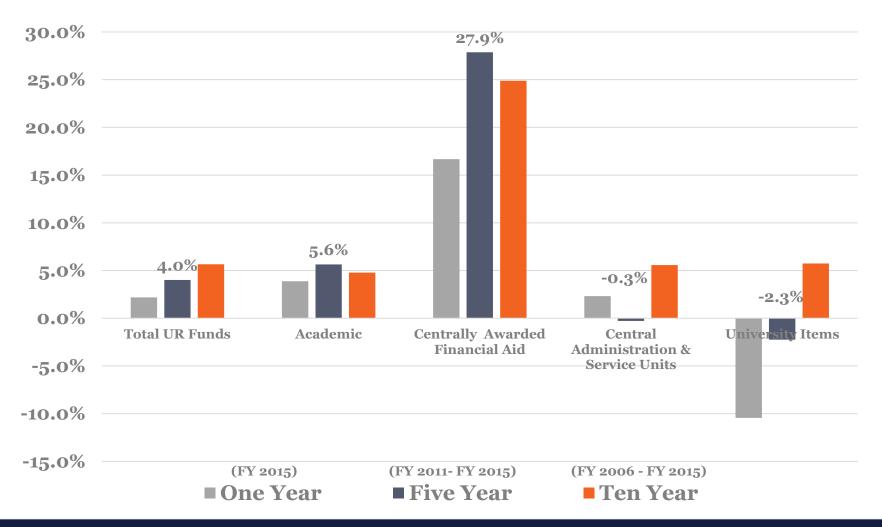

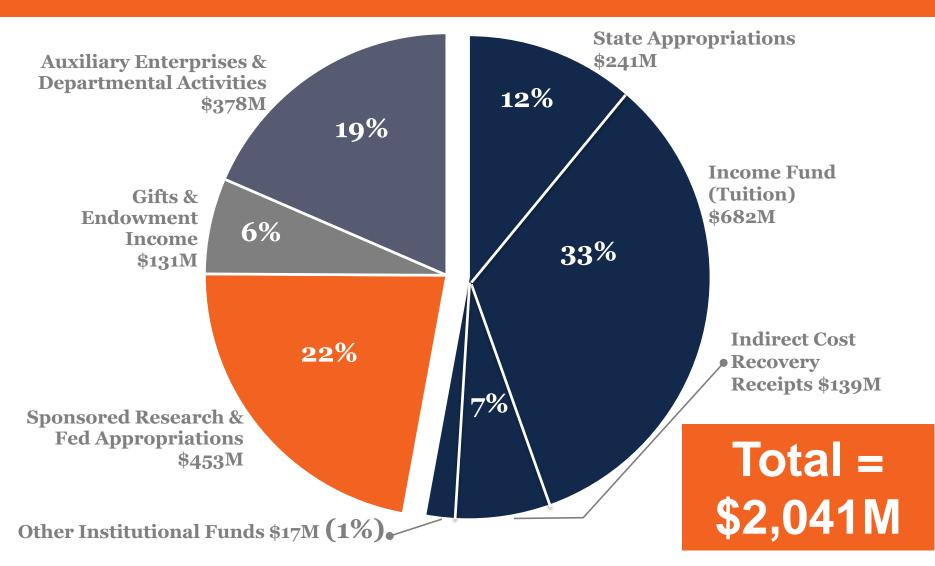
Budget Average Annual Growth



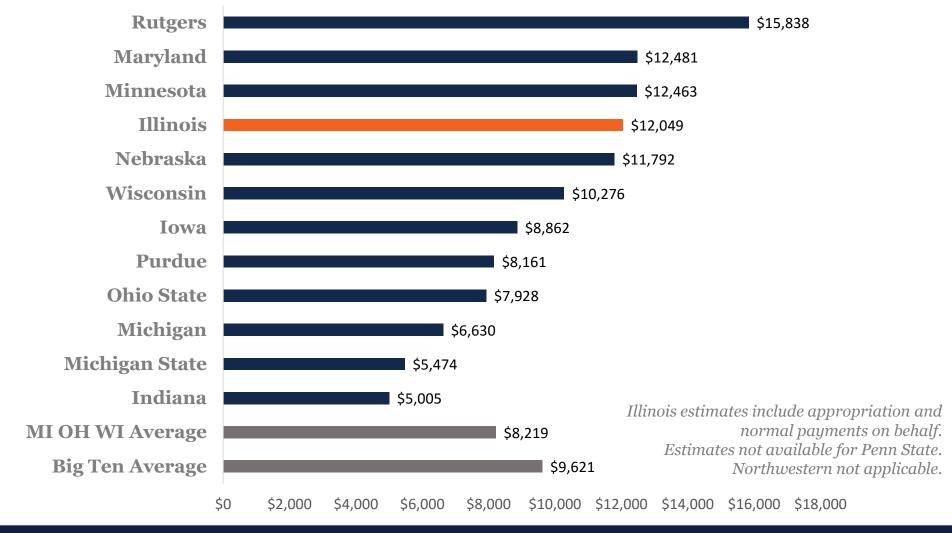
Summary of Changes in Growth

- Unrestricted sources add up to slightly over half of our budgeted revenues
- Growth in unrestricted sources is slowing overall
- Our investments in financial aid have been substantial
- Growth in central administration, services, and costs has slowed significantly

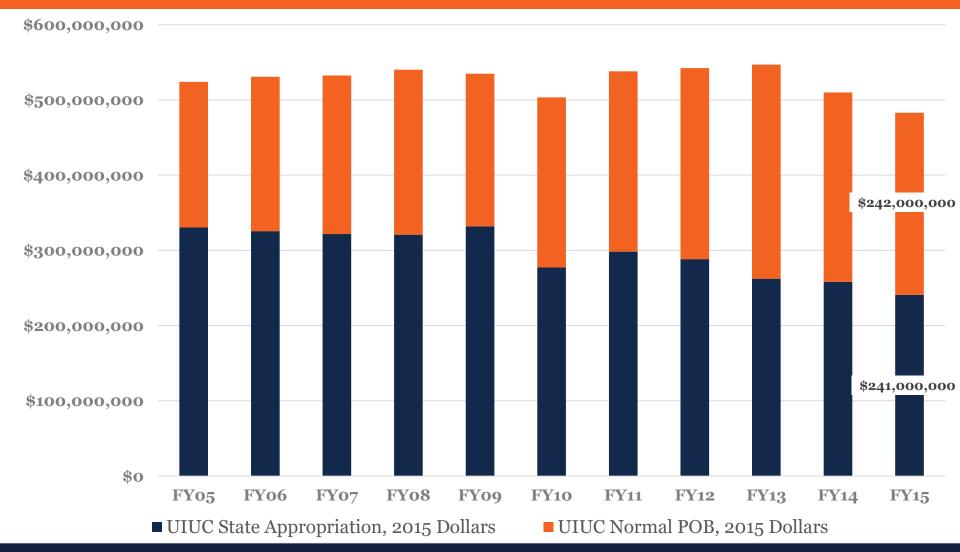
Budget Sources (FY15)

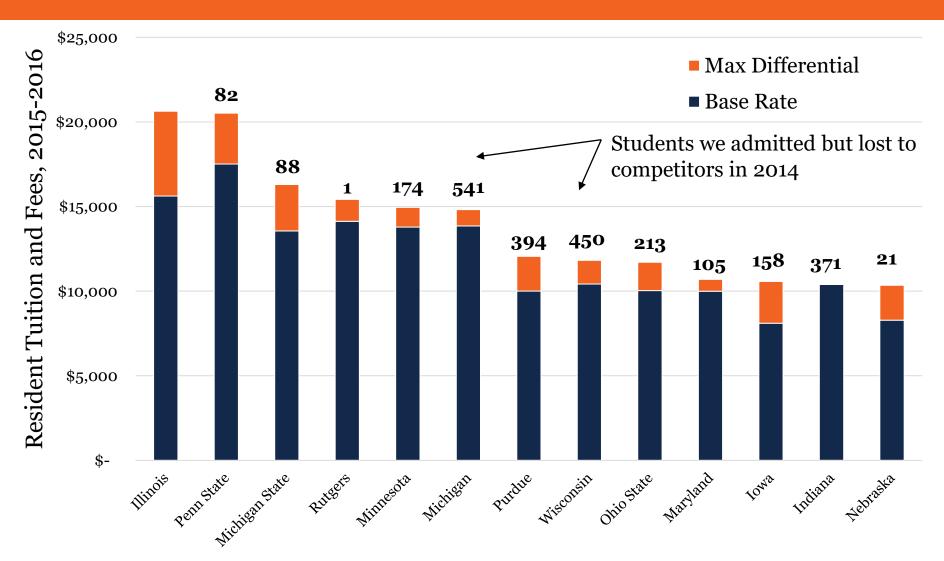

FY 2017 Planning

Developing plans to reduce dependence on State of Illinois support of 50% over 8-10 years

- Reallocations/reductions \$20M in FY 2017
- Challenging for all units
- Critical step to maintaining long-term viability as an institution
