I. OFFICE PROCEDURE - SERVICE TO INDIVIDUAL STUDENTS

A. Scope of Service and Statistics

The statistical data contained in this report includes both the monthly intake statistics and an annual statistic composite covering the period from August 1, 1981 to July 31, 1982. This information is included in the Appendix and reflects client contact in three broad categories: 1) general information and referral, 2) advice only, and 3) cases represented, as well as case-type categorization.

B. Complaints and Client Satisfaction

During the past year the Student Legal Service's office has continued its follow-up evaluation questionnaire procedure in an effort to measure client satisfaction with services rendered. The survey results contained in the Appendix are divided into two categories: "advice only" (problems generally resolved through advice of law students in direct consultation with the attorneys) and "clients" (cases in which one of the attorneys enters an appearance of record in a court proceeding). Questionnaires were sent to each client whose case was completed during that time period and to a randomly selected one out of ten "advice only" clients. All responses were tabulated.

B. Complaints and Client Satisfaction (cont.)

The questions presented can be divided into three cluster groups: a) program perceptions (Questions #1, 7-11, 13-15), b) case perceptions (Questions #2-4), and c) system perceptions (Questions #5-6, 12). The percentage response to each question if fully detailed in the Appendix.

a) Program Perceptions

Data assembled indicates a continuing overall high satisfaction with the Program among both advice only contacts (A.O.s) and clients.

b) Case Perceptions

Satisfaction with case handling was very high among clients. Although A.O.s indicated a slightly lesser degree of satisfaction, the overall perception is still extremely favorable.

c) System Perceptions

Both groups appear to be somewhat skeptical regarding the efficacy of the American legal system although there is considerable contradiction in the responses.

The survey results show a high degree of satisfaction with the Program and the quality of individual representation and counseling. Efforts will be made to maintain and improve upon this record.

II. PREVENTIVE LAW ACTIVITIES

One of the primary goals of the Student Legal Service's Plan is the maintainance of a significant legal educational program aimed at informing students of their rights and obligations under the law. The efforts expended in this direction have been designed to assist students in the management of their personal affairs in such a manner as to minimize potential legal problems. This program has involved both personal appearances by the attorneys and publication and distribution of written materials designed to inform students of their legal rights and responsibilities.

Over the past year, the Students' Attorneys have given numerous talks, seminars and workshops for campus groups and organizations. They have also participated in several University functions such as New Student Orientation, Quad Day, and the Campus Resource Fair. (See Appendix).

The office continues to provide students with the many informational pamphlets published by both the Illinois and American Bar Associations. In addition, the office has published and made widely available the <u>Student Legal Service Guide to Small Claims</u>

<u>Court</u>, the <u>Guide to the Student Legal Service's Program</u> and the <u>Your Legal Rights and Responsibilities booklets</u>.

Again this year efforts are being made to secure space in the Daily Illini newspaper for a column concerning various legal topics

of interest to students. It is hoped and anticipated that these negotiations will be successful.

Efforts are also being expended to broaden the number and scope of publications available through the office. Preliminary drafts have been completed on several topics and as resources permit, these will be completed and made available to students.

III. LIAISON WITH BAR ASSOCIATION

The Student Legal Service's Plan mandates that the Students'
Attorneys establish and maintain a liaison with the Champaign County
Bar Association in order to secure local support for the Program and
to facilitate effective and prompt handling of referrals. The
relationship that has developed between the Student Legal Service's
Program and the Champaign County Bar Association is excellent and
the local bar continues to be very supportive of the Program. During
the past year, Ed Rawles has served as the Champaign County Bar
Association Representative on the Student Legal Service Advisory
Board.

Both of the Students' Attorneys are active members of the Champaign County Bar Association, the Illinois State Bar Association and the American Bar Association. During the past year, I have continued as a member of the Illinois State Bar Association's Standing Committee on Legal Education and Admission to the Bar and as a representative from the Sixth Judicial Circuit to the Illinois State Bar Association General Assembly. I have also served as a member of the Board of Governors of the Champaign County Bar Association and the Executive Steering Committee of the Student Legal Service's Section of the National Legal Aid and Defenders Association.

IV. LAW STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM

The office has been fortunate during the past year to have had the participation of several law students in the Student Legal Service's Program under the auspices of the law school's clinical law program. Although the number of law students enrolling in the overall clinical program has declined during the past few years, Student Legal Services has managed to "employ" students both during the regular school year and the 1982 summer semester.

V. EVALUATION

The overall operation of the Program continues to reflect the broad success of the Plan. The office offers extensive educational opportunities to the student body at large and provides high-quality legal advice and representation to increasing numbers of individual students. The Program continues to receive broad support from the campus, the community and the local bar association. It has established itself as a viable and valuable service that benefits all students.

Present were: Michael Graham, Gina Haasis, Matt Kaufman, Clarence Krantz, Tim Madigan, Terry Markus, Donald McClarey, Fred Silberberg and Rick Witham.

Graham raised the issue that the Accounting Division has "apparently" located approximately \$23,000 in carry-over money for SLS. Haasis reported that the amount indicated to her by Accounting was \$22,179.82, but that she has not received any written confirmation at this time as to this amount. General discussion followed regarding the carry-over.

Graham asked the Trilateral Commission members to report on the current status of the Commission regarding an increase in the SORF fee. McClarey and Krantz indicated that they felt that SGA nor SORF would be responsive to the proposed increase in fees. McClarey indicated that SGA/SORF will be holding a referendum in April regarding the increased fee proposal. Graham proposed that with the increase, \$2 could go towards SORF and the other \$2 could go towards SLS, however, the SORF portion could be refundable, but not the SLS portion. Madigan stated that he did not feel the Board of Trustees would approve a mandatory fee for the SLS Program. General discussion followed regarding each members feelings towards this proposal. Witham stated that with the substantial carry-over, SLS should just sit back and be low-key to this whole issue. Madigan agreed, along with the remainder of the Board members taking this position also.

Graham questioned Witham as to his tenure possibilities with SLS. Witham stated that at this time, his "tentative" plans are to remain with SLS for approximately l^1_2 more years, however he made no definite decision at this time.

Krantz proposed that some sort of long-range buget planning guidelines be established.

Haasis raised the issue of printing of the SLS Guide to Small Claims Court. It was agreed that the booklets should be ordered at this time.

Witham presented a petition for representation for a student regarding a felony charge. General discussion followed regarding the case involved and the offices policy on representation in felony cases. McClarey questioned as to whether the student would be eligible for representation through the Public Defenders Office. Witham indicated that the only person who could determine this would be a Judge. Graham, Kaufman, Krantz, Markus and Silberberg voted in favor of the petition, Madigan and McClarey against; the petition was approved.

Graham again emphasized that with the current carry-over allowance, the Commission members should find out how SGA/SORF will handle the referendum. He stressed that it should be made clear to proponents of any change in the way SORF monies are allocated that such a change would not effect the allocation off the top designated for SLS.

The next meeting was scheduled for Thursday, April 15, 1982 at 12:00 Noon.

However, no firm carry-over balance figure was available to date from the University Accounting sources.

Haasis raised the issue of further printing of the SLS publication on Small Claims Court. Graham indicated that the figures available regarding SLS finances did not allow for any such expenditure at this time.

A discussion followed regarding the need for specific delineation of any carry-over balance. Graham asked that a budget be prepared by the students' attorneys projecting SLS expenditures until the Fall semester allocation in October, 1982.

Aids for filling out tax forms available

The thought of filling out tax forms may frighten some students, but there are several places they can go for help.

The Internal Revenue Service offers a toll free number to answer any tax questions. Calls are taken at 800-972-5400, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., seven days a week. More than 80 publications which can be ordered from tax packages are also conclude from the IRS.

The Champaign Public Library has a "tax tape" available. It takes the listener step by step through the Form 1040A, and 1040 itemized deductions, interest and dividend income portions. The Undergraduate Library also has documents, tapes and manuals to aid students filling out tax returns. Several tax books have been ordered and will be available in the near future, according to a library employee.

The Champaign Park District is

offering a series of sessions on processing income tax returns the first three Mondays in February. More information about these workshops is available from the park district.

The Illini Union Board discovery program, the Student Legal Services office and the Champaign Bar Association are offering a workshop March 31 to help students prepare income tax forms. The \$2 fee and reigstration for this session must be paid by March 29.

SORF offers legal aid

Need legal advice? As a U of I student, you have access to legal help—that is, if you haven't asked for a refund of your \$3 Student Organizatior Resource Fee (SORF).

The Student Legal Service Progra on campus is here to inform you of your rights and responsibilities under the law and to help resolve legal problems you may encounter while a student.

There are some important facts to know about the Student Legal Service Program, however.

While all students paying their SORF money are eligible for legal advice from the two full-time attorneys and law students associated with the office, they do not necessarily qualify for actual representation in court. In-court representation is automatically provided for eligible students for housing problems. In other areas including litiga-

"They contract out with us for our services. Basically, we run a private law office, with services pre-paid," said Witham.

Witham and Gina Haasis are the two full-time attorneys and are assisted by a full-time secretary and varying number of law students in the law school's clinical program.

"The students get academic credit for their work here—it's like an internship for them," said Witham. He said about three or four students per semester are associated with the program.

The Student Legal Service Program office is Room 268 Illini Union. It is open from 8:30 a.m. to noon and 1 to 4:30 p.m. weekdays during the school year, including summer sessions. Students must come to the office in person and show their I.D.s to show that they are eligible, namely that they have not received a SORF refund. They are asked to fill out a questionnaire to outline their problem or question. An appointment is then scheduled so the student can discuss this concern with one of the attorneys or a law student.

"Students can come in and get advice even if they don't qualify (because of their income) for actual representation. We can tell them, 'Yes, you have a legal problem and you should get outside legal counsel,' or 'Look, it's not a legal problem but more of a bureaucratic problem, and here's where

Services available include help on ontract and consumer matters; governmental matters such as unemployment compensation, social security, welfare, military and selective service; petitions in bankruptcy; defending claims against students; family law matters such as divorce and child custody; employment problems; smalcalims and criminal matters; University academic and disciplinary hearings.

There are a number of areas in which the office will not help students. These include any claims against the University or the State. The attorneys also will

to go," said Witham.

He said a lot of students seem to be aware of the service, although they are not always sure what the guidelines are.

According to Witham, the office had contact with 4,221 students between August 1, 1980 and July 31, 1981. That averaged out to 18 people per day the office was open. Actual cases in which litigation was started during that time period totalled 271.

A lot of the cases—18.3 percent—involved housing problems. Seventeen percent involved traffic matters, 8.5 percent were criminal matters, while 8 percent involved family situations, such as divorce or adoptions.

"We will not represent people in court unless they are in danger of losing their license or it's a Class A misdemeanor where you could get 364 days in the slammer," said Witham.

Other matters that are brought to the office include financial problems, such as hassles from creditors or bankruptcy; civil suits involving automobile accidents; immigration law questions; grievances with an employer; disputes with local merchants.

Witham said the office is quite busy. Although he believes the existing funding arrangement is adequate to continue providing legal services, he said not help draft deeds of trust, real estate transactions, wills or similar documents. "The reason is that we believe people seeking these probably will have the resources to afford an outside lawyer," said Rick Witham, one of the two full-time attorneys operating the program.

According to Witham, the service is completely funded by SORF which pays it an annual budget of \$60,000 under an arrangement with the University's Board of Trustees.

"We get the money 'off the top.' SORF has no control of us, or of the allocation," said Witham, explaining that the service is not part of the University program but instead operates under the auspices of the Board of Trustees.

more funding could allow the program to expand.

"It's a question of quantity, not quality. If we had more money, we could do more with our efforts to inform and educate students on legal matters," he said, explaining that the office also puts out publications and takes part in seminars and public speaking engagements to promote legal education for students in general.

If there were additional resources and time, he said, "We could engage in broader based litigation which is more complex.

"Lawsuits are very expensive deals," he said. "We operate on a shoestring, which is fine, but gee, wouldn't it be nice to expand our publications, our library, our concentration?" And, he added, it would be nice to have a typewriter with a memory for paperwork.

The office publishes a booklet, Student Legal Service's Programs, which explains how students can make use of the service. The booklets are distributed to students during New Student Week, at Quad Day and during Resident Advisor orientations, and are available at the office.

"It would be great if we could mail the booklet out to all incoming students, but that costs money," he

Students seeking an appointment with the Student Legal Service Program staff will find one provided within two to five days of their request.

"We generally see them, on an average, in two to three days. It's quite reasonable, and I'm quite proud of our record," said Witham.

The goal, he said, "is to at least get that initial contact quickly. This is very important as the problem can be very significant to the student. They need to know where they stand. It may not be that serious a legal matter bart, to them,


