1986 ANNUAL REPORT

This past year has been marked by changes in personnel at the Student Legal Service. In November, 1985, Brenda Hook was hired as a Students' Attorney upon her being admitted to practice law in Illinois. Ms. Hook had been working at SLS since graduating from the University's College of Law in May, 1985. In January, 1986, Bryan Savage, the other Students' Attorney, left SLS to engage in private practice on a full-time basis, and Thomas Betz was hired as a Students' Attorney. Mr. Betz came to SLS after several years of private law practice in Detroit, Michigan. As of February, 1986, our secretary, Mary Pyle, is no longer at SLS. At this time SLS is still being served well by a temporary secretary, but it is hoped that a permanent secretary will be hired in the near future.

In April SLS was very fortunate to receive a complete set of West's U.S. Code Annotated from the Campus Legal Counsel's office at the University's Chicago Campus. The Students' Attorneys have appreciated this addition to the SLS library.

In late May and early June the entire SLS office was painted, and many pieces of furniture were replaced with newer furnishings from the office of Campus Legal Counsel here at the Urbana campus. The Students' Attorneys used this opportunity to reorganize the office into a more logical arrangement by putting into separate areas the library, the


clients' waiting area, and the secretary's work area. The attorneys hope to get a large pamphlet rack for the client waiting area as soon as possible, as a good deal of effort has been put into updating and adding to the collection of free legal pamphlets produced by the state and county bar associations and various governmental agencies.

In the Spring semester, 1986, the Students' Attorneys had to face the realization that SLS expenditures over the past year had surpassed available funds. To alleviate this problem, the attorneys took some immediate steps such as cancelling many subscriptions, returning unused office supplies and equipment, and more closely monitoring long distance phone calls. While these steps have helped, the attorneys wish to emphasize that the Advisory Board will very soon need to consider some long-term solutions to the budget problems at SLS.


During the Spring semester SLS was the recipient of a one-time grant from O.F.A.B. The grant had been applied for by the students on the Advisory Board and was designated specifically for computer software and for SLS publications. The software was ordered and is currently being used by the temporary secretary with the help of Erica Ziemer of the SORF office. A booklet on alcohol law, which included a summary of the new DUI legislation, was written by Mr. Betz and his wife, Jane Williams, a librarian at the University's College of Law.

Although the Students' Attorneys are not voting members of the Advisory Board, they are present at Board meetings and have been encouraged to provide regular reports on the status of SLS and give input on matters being discussed by the Board. During the Spring semester, the Board devoted much time to discussing recommendations which had been made by Mr. James Van Arsdel of the Housing Division following a series of meetings he had with the Students' Attorneys and with various Board members. The Board incorporated some of those recommendations into a set of by-laws, which at this writing have not yet been adopted. The Students' Attorneys believe that these recommendations are in general very helpful and that the following recommendations in particular should be implemented as quickly as possible: the appointment of an Advisor/Manager as the liaison between the SLS office, the Advisory Board, and the rest of the University; the appointment of more students to the Board and for longer terms in order to provide more continuity from year to year. We look forward to a smoother operation once the new procedures are implemented.
